



CoC NY-511: Binghamton/Uniontown, Broome, Chenango, Cortland, Delaware, Otsego, & Tioga Counties

Notice of Funding Availability (NOFA) for U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) FY 2018 Continuum of Care (CoC) Program Competition

The Southern Tier Homeless Coalition/CoC NY-511 is issuing a **Request for Proposals** for [Continuum of Care Program](https://www.hudexchange.info/resource/5719/fy-2018-coc-program-nofa/) homeless assistance projects that meet *New Project* eligibility criteria as outlined in HUD's FY 2018 CoC Program Competition NOFA for *Bonus Project* and *DV Bonus* funding: <https://www.hudexchange.info/resource/5719/fy-2018-coc-program-nofa/>.

An estimated **\$179,321** of *Bonus Project* funding is available. Eligible program components for new projects created through the bonus process as prioritized by CoC NY-511 are as follows:

- 1) Rapid Re-housing (PH-RRH) – *New Project RFP* responses must indicate capacity to provide PH-RRH that covers the entire geographic region of CoC NY-511 (Broome, Chenango, Cortland, Delaware, Otsego, & Tioga Counties).
- 2) Permanent Supportive Housing (PH-PSH) – *New Project RFP* responses must indicate whether the project will operate as *DedicatedPLUS* (Section III.C.3.f) or will dedicate 100% of project beds to chronically homeless individuals and families.

An estimated **\$298,868** of *DV Bonus* (Section II.B.3) project funding is available. Eligible program components for new projects created through the DV Bonus process as prioritized by CoC NY-511 are as follows:

- 1) Rapid Re-housing (PH-RRH) projects that follow a Housing First approach
- 2) Joint TH and PH-RRH component projects (Section II.C.3.m) that follow a Housing First approach
- 3) SSO Projects for Coordinated Entry
 - Existing *Renewal Projects* MAY NOT apply for DV Bonus funding to expand a project that is not dedicated to providing victims services in order to dedicate additional beds, units, services etc. to survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking that meet the definition of homeless in paragraph 4 of 24 CFR 578.3.
